



Hempton Parish Council

Annual Parish Meeting Minutes

Thursday 20 May 2021, 7.15pm

Parish Councillors present: Vivien Woods, Carol Stubbs, Christine Haydon, Tom FitzPatrick (County Councillor). Also in attendance: Jodie Bond (Parish Clerk), Inspector Terri Cooper-Barnes, PC Rich Dawson. There were 3 members of the public present.

1. Vivien Woods, Chairman of the Parish Council, welcome and Chairman's report.

The Chairman welcomed all those present and thanked everyone for attending.

Apologies were received from Cllr Ainger, Cllr Housden (District Councillor), Jerome Mayhew MP and Tom Raynham (Raynham Estate). Apologies accepted.

2. Approval of Minutes of Annual Parish Meeting held on 16 May 2019

The minutes were approved without amendment.

3. Jerome Mayhew MP

Jerome Mayhew was unfortunately unable to attend due to an urgent matter keeping him in London. However, will endeavour to attend our meeting in July.

4. Tom Raynham of Raynham Estate

Tom Raynham was unable to attend due to unforeseen circumstances.

5. Inspector Terri Cooper-Barnes and PC Rich Dawson of Norfolk Police

PC Dawson reported that following the last SNAP meeting 2% of issues were drug related and 3% ASB within the whole area. The panel voted to keep the SNAP meetings going, to include speeding in the area and community speed watches are being promoted by the police.

The police have been spending some time at Fakenham Academy, as there have been a few issues with safeguarding.

Cllr Woods asked whether there is any input from the community at the school – PC Dawson advised that they are working with Nula Cooper in a mobile unit, looking to engage with youths after school and during the evenings. If people notice antisocial behaviour, it should be reported immediately to the police.

Fakenham Town Council want to close the skate park at Millennium Park, Queens Road following complaints about the noise from local residents. PC Dawson advised that they plan to close the skate park temporarily until it is approved to be moved to the middle of the park. If it is relocated noise levels should be reduced.

Cllr Stubbs was concerned that the Bullock Hills may be affected further if the Fakenham skate park is closed. The police have spoken to Raynham Estate regarding the possibility of earmarking a suitable area at the

Bullock Hills for bike riding, however there are concerns with insurance liability and other risk factors, so they are uncertain whether this would be a feasible or pragmatic solution.

PC Dawson did go on to explain that luckily, we do not have significant antisocial behaviour problem and it's not as bad here as it is in other places, but they would shift their focus if necessary.

Cllr Woods asked whether there is any county lines activity in Fakenham – PC Dawson confirmed that there isn't at present. It mostly occurs in the city with dealers coming in on trains. This may be Covid-19 related 'respite' due to other means of transport were impacted by restrictions.

Following the road accident in Hempton earlier today, there were 3 vehicles involved which was due to driver error and only minor injuries were sustained.

PC Dawson is pleased about the proposed roundabout as it should help with road traffic incidents. PC Dawson commented that it is unusual to get a roundabout on B and C designated roads.

Inspector Cooper-Barnes reported that they have a good number of officers at present and are looking ahead to an expected busy summer. There is a new Beat Manger at Wells -next-the-Sea. There are now two situated at Wells as they are expecting many visitors and they want to manage that demand.

Thanks were given to the Officers for attending the meeting.

6. District Councillor, Nigel Housden

Nigel Housden was unable to attend but messaged that he had nothing to report.

7. County Councillor, Tom FitzPatrick

- The new SEN school is progressing on schedule and is planned to open in January 2022. It will be named Duke of Lancaster School in recognition of the site's history.
- NCC are pushing to recruit more foster carers – there are record numbers of children in the system.
- Four buses have been converted to carry out the testing service for Covid-19.
- The NHS and County Council websites are continuously updated with the latest news.
- The Government are launching a clinical trial to booster coronavirus vaccines. 20 million people in the UK have received both doses of vaccine.
- Help and support is available through a project called 'Chances' which is giving one to one support to get people back to work.
- Norfolk schools are open and the position is stabilising – with 94.9% primary school children attending school which is above the national average and 89% of secondary school pupils attending which is in line with the national average.
- The Hempton roundabout consultation is now open until 6 June. Visit [Norfolk.gov/hempton](https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/hempton) to make comments. Originally £1.25 million was earmarked for this project has now been increased to £1.67 million. There was some discussion about the closing date of the consultation period particularly in light of the late/non arrival of documents. Cllr FitzPatrick stated that the closing date would be extended to accept submissions received after 6 June 2021.
- Norfolk Fire Service are giving advice on water safety, especially with the weather getting warmer to include not going swimming in quarries or anywhere that is not a formerly designated swimming location.

8. Other Parish Organisations, if attending

Poors Land.

CLlr Stubbs advised that the Poors Land is still being rented and the funds are being distributed to various local causes including funding to Fakenham Medical Practice to buy new beds.

Memorial Hall

The hall was closed for most of 2020 due to Covid-19. It was briefly opened last summer for one car boot sale.

Various small business grants have been received from NNDC.

New flooring has been laid to replace the carpet tiles and new chairs have been purchased.

The Hall Committee has been approached by the DVLA to consider becoming a driving theory test centre.
