We hope to have everything in order by the end of June allowing us to have our first meeting of the newly formed Parish Council in July.

Some maintenance work is being scheduled and the annual ROSPA Inspection (Health & Safety) is going to take place in early June.

Are you related to the Schoolmistress? by Claire Travis

You may remember from the November 2021 issue I had found out that the Hempton Village school started life in the Vicarage in the early 1860s and it had a schoolmistress named Mrs Susannah Bell.

So, I wondered is there anyone still living in the parish who is her descendant?

When tracking Susanna through genealogical records she was baptised on 28 March 1823 in Wood Norton the daughter of William Wright (a publican) and Elizabeth. Susannah married Shakespeare Bell on 18 July 1843 at Field Dalling. Shakespeare was from Wells and born March 1818 to Shakespeare Reynolds Bell and Sarah nee Loose. Susannah and Shakespeare Bell had four children.

Abraham Stevenson Richard (1845-1861), Sarah Elizabeth (1847-), Mary Ann (1849-), Susannah (1851-1893). Neither Abraham or Susannah married or had children it appears. Sarah was still in Hempton unmarried aged 40. Mary last found in the records aged 12. Shakespeare Bell died aged 38 and was buried at Fakenham on 24 April 1856. The funeral was conducted by Charles Moxon the first Vicar of Hempton. With four children and no husband times were probably hard for Susannah, this is no doubt why she became a teacher in the Vicarage school.

In 1861 census she said she was a teacher, in 1871 and 1881 a school mistress. By 1891 Susannah no longer declares an occupation. In 1901 Susannah was living at Front Green, Hempton, aged 76 a retired schoolmistress.

Susannah died in Hempton in November 1911.
