George Smallpeice, Hempton's longest serving Vicar, by Claire Travis

Whilst researching the history of Hempton Church and Vicarage I have been using Crockford's Clerical Directory as a reference. First published 1848 it lists ordained ministers.

The directories have been really helpful in finding out who lived in the Vicarage. One of the longest residents was George Smallpeice. George arrived with his wife Norah in December 1905.

In 1909 the village midwife, Mary Southgate, attended the Vicarage to deliver George's second child John. George, his

wife and two children were living in the Vicarage during the 1911 and 1921 census.

In 1921, when the Church of England re-established the Shrine of our Lady at Walsingham, George Smallpeice was present at the inauguration and pilgrims again made their way through Hempton to Walsingham.

Norah Smallpeice died 2 April 1926 aged 54 and was buried at Fakenham Cemetery. George married Alice Mary Hayes at Sedgeford parish church on 27 December 1928.

I discovered George in a Daily Mirror article from 31 December 1938 in a report from Fakenham Magistrates Court. The article was a little vague but I worked out that George gave evidence that he had refused to marry the daughter of Horatio and Edith Wright as she was only 15. Cecilia, was married 14th May 1938 to Evelyn W Balls. The Wrights produced a family bible as evidence that she was in fact 16, but the bible had been changed. The parents were fined £2 2s and costs. In the 1939 National Registration, Cecilia confirmed her age when she stated her birthday was 25 March 1923, making her 15 when she was married. I have yet to find out who married Evelyn and Cecilia but the registration district is Walsingham, so local. The 1939 registration also shows that George was living in the Vicarage with his wife Alice.

From the parish records, George carried out a funeral 6 March 1948 but not the next one on 25 April 1948. Several entries on, is George's funeral entry on 8 April 1949. George served this parish and community for about 43 years.
