Tales of a former Vicar

Part One: When the Vicar's Great-Granddaughter came to tea

By a series of coincidences, Nikki recently met Claire, the current occupant of the Old Vicarage, and introduced herself as one of the great grandchildren of George Smallpeice, Vicar of Hempton (1905-1949).

George was born in 1868 in St Bees, Northumberland, and the ninth child of ten. Like his father before him, he went into the church and following his ordination was sent to Cardiff as a curate to Fr. Jones, known as the pioneer of the Catholic revival in Wales. We believe that it was here that he met his future wife, Norah.




Norah's early life is shrouded in mystery. It is thought that she was a foundling, possibly from Ireland, but we do know that in 1877, when she was baptized, she was living in an orphanage in East Grinstead, and was adopted by Mr and Mrs Ralph Walker. The story goes that, when her adoptive mother died, she was sent, with an annuity from Ralph Walker, to live in a convent...maybe in Cardiff?

She certainly met George when she was in her late teens or early twenties as they married in 1905 and moved to Hempton. Grandmother Margaret arrived in November 1906 and Granduncle John was born in 1909.

NEW VICAR OF HEMPTON. The King has been pleased, by letters patent under the Great Seal, to present the Rev. George Smallpeice, M.A., to the vicarage of Hempton, in the county of Norfolk and diocese of Norwich, void by the cession of the Rev. Samuel Lee Coverley, the last incumbent, and in his Majesty's gift in full right.

Norah was apparently a model wife and mother, much loved by all her parishioners. She died aged only 54 in April 1926. It is rumoured that her cortege stretched from Hempton Vicarage right to Fakenham Cemetery in Queens Road and included the Foreign Secretary, Sir Austen Chamberlain and the King of the Gypsies. There was a gypsy encampment each year on Hempton Green.

Her grateful parishioners put a brass plaque on the church wall in her memory and her children presented the hanging rood, made by a Ukrainian POW, when the church was rededicated in 1955 following its extension. The rood screen was repainted in the 1980s.





George remarried in 1928. His bride was Alice Mary Hayes was born in Camberwell but moved to Ipswich when her father also a clergyman, got a new Parish.

She was eleven years younger than George was, and some five years younger than her predecessor was. Her stepchildren and husband called her Marygold. She took over Norah's role until George died on 4th April 1949. He died peacefully at his daughter's house in Peterborough surrounded by his family. The story goes that he spoke to his beloved Norah as he died, praising her beauty as she sat under the apple tree in the vicarage garden, much to the embarrassment of Marygold!
